The Southwest Section has not had any meetings since our Spring Gather in San Antonio in April. Consequently, I am submitting highlights from my report submitted for the June BOD meeting and updates on items that were reported.

The Southwest Section held one meeting in April of this year in San Antonio, Texas. The business meeting was held in the morning and we traveled to Bob Lewandowski's home shop for glassblowing demonstrations and discussions in the afternoon. The meeting was sponsored by Ace Glass, Friedrich and Dimmock and Technical Glass Products. Our section greatly appreciated the vendor's attendance and support of our section.

One new change was made this year in the administration of the Southwest Section. The Secretary/Treasurer position was divided into 2 positions. Bob Singer was retained as Treasurer and Ben Spaulding was voted in to be the new Secretary. All other current officers have one more year on their elected term.
